ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

CBYDR has a counselor to student ratio of 1:12, fast-paced schedule, large group activities, etc.
 For this reason, we ask that you carefully consider the girls you recommend to CBYDR.
 Below are the requirements all girls must meet.

ELIGIBLE IF...
1. Student is in a family / program type residential treatment program of either <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • North Carolina Association of Residential Child Care and Family Services member agency • South Carolina Association of Children's Homes and Family Services member agency • private agency • North or South Carolina county Department of Social Services
2. She is successfully learning to achieve higher levels of appropriate behavior and decision making.
3. She is able to function at a higher level of independent living.
4. She has few limitations in managing personal health and safety without supervision.
5. She is learning to form trusting relationships with authority figures / peers.
6. She is currently maintaining / developing personal living skills (anger management, communication, peer pressure, proper self-concept) and would benefit from a program to aid in learning such behaviors.
7. She demonstrates ability to participate in group discussions / team building exercises.
8. She is currently at low risk of causing physical harm to property, self, and others due to improper anger management.
9. She is currently at zero to moderate risk for sexual offense/re-offending.
10. She has been in your care for at least 6 months.
11. She will be 13 – 19 years old when the conference begins.

NOT ELIGIBLE IF...
1. SHE IS A MEMBER OF A GANG.
2. Student is in a high or secure residential treatment program of either <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • North Carolina Association of Residential Child Care and Family Services member agency • South Carolina Association of Children's Homes and Family Services member agency • private agency • North or South Carolina county Department of Social Services
3. Staff must actively / consistently be involved with helping student "unlearn" inappropriate behaviors.
4. She is not capable, at date, to maintain stability without constant staff intervention.
5. She has significant deficits in managing personal health and safety without supervision.
6. She is incapable, at date, to form trusting relationships with authority figures / peers.
7. Currently she occasionally or often requires physical restraints of some type. She is currently in need of a staff to be on overnight awake.
8. She has difficulty discussing at any level / demonstrates inability for group cooperation.
8. She is currently at moderate -- high risk of causing physical harm to property, self, or others due to improper anger management.
10. She is currently at moderate to high risk of sexual re-offending.
11. She has been in your care for less than 6 months.
12. She will be outside the ages of 13 - 19 when the conference begins.
